NATIONAL DEBATE FORUM going Virtual

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Young Mediterranean Voices (YMV) is launching a month-long, region-wide programme of debate competitions and national debate forums between October and November 2020 across eight South Mediterranean countries (Algeria, Egypt, Jordan, Lebanon, Libya, Morocco, Palestine and Tunisia).

The National Debate Forum Egypt is built on a three-day event involving teams from seven different national debate hubs with over **96 participants**. There will be **22 debates** through the three-day National Debate Forum. 15 debates will be run in Arabic in parallel with seven debates in English. The motions of the debates will be based on themes linked to **the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), contributing to the 2030 agenda for sustainable development**. Each debate will feature teams of young debaters from four debate hubs who will present evidence to validate their argument for or against a motion linked to specific SDG. Issues, challenges, arguments and recommendations will be captured.

This year, it is true that the global pandemic has forced us to limit our face-to-face interaction; however, the technology has given us unprecedented opportunities for leaning, dialogues, and connectiveness.

The national Debate Forum will follow a **blended approach virtually and face-to-face** bringing over **96 young debaters** and **36 facilitators** from across cities and villages of Egypt.

CONTRIBUTION TO THE 2030 AGENDA FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

The National Debate Forum will highlight national and global priorities under the framework of SDGs, it will be an opportunity for young people to exchange their views, to dialogue and to find innovative and sustainable solutions.

Therefore, the Forum proposes the following SDGs:

SDG 4 'Quality Education' SDG 10 'Reduce Inequality within and among countries' SDG 13 'Climate Action'





CAPACITY BUILDING WORKSHOP

The Forum will further develop capacity through capacity building sessions including policy motions, policy process, understanding sustainable development, in addition to other subjects.

POLICY DIALOGUE

Additionally, we are inviting relevant stakeholders, where youth will present a particular theme to be discussed with policy makers and influencers in collaboration with EU Delegations and national/local authorities, as a means to generate dialogue and mentor the young debaters in sharpening their content in order to formulate more efficient policy recommendations.

METHODOLOGY

We propose 4 phases for the Forum to be as impactful as possible:

- **1** Inter-hub competition and team formation: a pre-qualifier phase to prepare teams to practice debate and further adapt to the virtual format. Teams also get to know each other better to work together during the National Debate Forum.
- 2/ The capacity building phase: it will include a refresher on policy motion debating, aiming at the generation of policy recommendations, debate club development, in addition to other sessions. The phase also explains the format of the online/virtual forum in addition to introducing the facilitators/adjudicators.
- 3/ The Debate phase: where virtual/blended debates will take place and content will be generated, in the form of arguments and recommendations. The debates will follow the British Parliamentary format in addition to Oxford style for the final debate. This year final debates will be broadcasted online and open for public registration.

4/ The Policy Forum phase: a high level discussion around policy recommendations generated in the Debate phase, with the involvement of relevant stakeholders, where youth will present a particular theme to be discussed with policy makers and influencers in collaboration with EU Delegations and national/local authorities.
